- Based on this chapter, what question did the Corinthians ask the Apostle Paul?
- Why was eating meat that had been sacrificed to a pagan idol a problem for some Christians?
- Knowledge is good, but what warning does the Apostle give about obtaining knowledge?
- What does the Apostle mean in verse 8 when he writes, “Food will not commend us to God”?
- How would you use verse 8 to address someone who believes that Christians are still under the food laws from the Mosaic Covenant?
- Why is verse 9 a key verse to this entire chapter?
- How is the Apostle Paul exhorting us in this chapter to respond to believers whose faith is still weak and undeveloped?
- In verse 12, we learn that sinning against a brother or sister is the same as sinning against Jesus. Why is that?
- Since we’re not dealing with meat sacrificed to idols today, in what areas might we practice protecting those with a weak faith by laying down our rights?
