- What does verse 3 tell us about Herod's character?
- Why was Herod forced to delay Peter's execution?
- Read verse 5. What does "earnest prayer" look like?
- Why do you think the believers who were praying for Peter refused to believe that he
 was really outside knocking at the gate?
- Why do you think believers pray but sometimes without expectation?
- What do you think is the best way to define praying with real faith and expectation?
- Does chapter 12 suggest to you that James was killed because the believers did not pray for him? If so, why? If not, why is this fact important?
- God saved Peter from being executed by Herod (see 12:6–11), but He allowed James to die (see 12:2). What conclusions about persecution, prayer, and deliverance can we draw from this?
- What does chapter 12 show about the heart of God?
