Discussion Questions for Hebrews 10 (Part 3):26-39

- In the context of 10:19–39, what sin do you think the author is talking about in 10:26?
- How does the context of the book of Hebrews help you to know what is being said in verse 26?
- If the Hebrew Christians reject Christ's provision for sin, what can they expect (see 10:26–27)?
- How can we take to heart the warning to avoid the sin that is described in verse 29?
- The word "**trampled**" (10:29) means scorned or counted as worthless. This is the attitude of someone who, while walking along, sees a penny on the ground and walks by it or kicks it into the gutter. The penny is considered worthless and so is trampled. What could cause someone to do that with the Son of God?
- The word "Remember" (10:32) means to carefully think back, reconstruct in your mind. The present tense in Greek means that this should be a continuous action or habit. What is the writer telling them to remember and why is that important for Christians to do?
- What does **10:32–33** reveal about the past experiences of this group of Hebrew Christians?
- How did they respond (see 10:34)?
- What does it mean to "shrink back" (10:39)?
- How are Christians today being tempted to "**shrink back**" (10:39)? How can you go about resisting this temptation?
- What kind of "confidence" is the author referring to in 10:35?
- With what "better and lasting possessions" (10:34) will we be "richly rewarded" (10:35) as God "has promised" (10:36) if we persevere in confidence in doing God's will?
- What one exhortation or promise from this study would you like to take to heart this week?
