Read Romans 11

Questions about the Passage:

- What is "Replacement Theology?"
- What proof does Paul give in verse 1 that God hasn't rejected Israel?
- When Paul says "the rest were hardened," is he speaking of people truly seeking God and then blinded by God so they wouldn't be allowed to find Him?
- What is Paul asking in **verse 11** when he asks "...**did they stumble in order that they might** fall?"
- Why were the branches representing Israel broken off from the root?
- What is holding believers in relationship with God?

Digging Deeper:

- Have you or has someone you know been exposed to Replacement Theology?
- Why do you think Replacement Theology has caught on with some people?
- Paul speaks of a "**mystery**" in **verse 25**. What does the word "mystery" refer to the New Testament?
- What is the mystery that Paul refers to?
- Who does "all Israel" mean in verse 26?
- Why are Jews enemies of Christians from the standpoint of the Gospel?
- **Read Galatians 3:29**. Does this verse seem to support Replacement Theology? What does it mean?

redemptive plan?
How does this study affect the way you see Israel?
How should we view Paul's final verses of the chapter where he declares that all this is beyond
our intellect?
